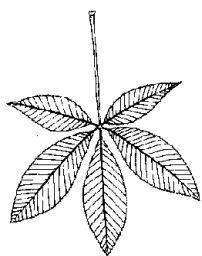


ArborTags



Like the Horse Chestnut the leaf is palmately compound (like the palm of your hand) with 5 leaflets without stems. The leaflets are 4-7 inches long, broader toward the tip which is pointed.

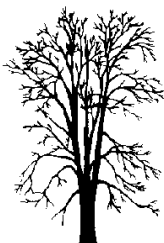
Sweet Buckeye



The flowers are 4-7 inches long clusters of yellow blossoms which bloom in the late spring. The poisonous seed is borne in a smooth pod unlike the Horse Chestnut which has a prickly pod.

A related species, the Ohio Buckeye (*Aesculus glabra*) has smaller, narrower, leaflets, and the seed pods are spiny. The Ohio State tree is the only horse chestnut with bright orange fall color.
