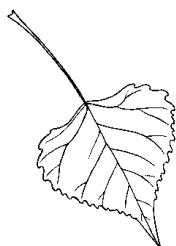


# ArborTags



The triangular leaves are 3-7 inches long and 3-5 inches wide. They terminate in a long point and have curved coarse teeth. The leaf stem is nearly as long as the leaf itself.

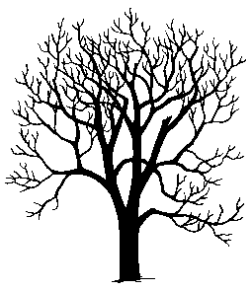
