The leaves are ordinarily 2-3 inches long and coarsely saw-toothed, sometimes even lobed. The mid vein is often quite pronounced. The regular Apple has a more regular, unlobed, leaf.

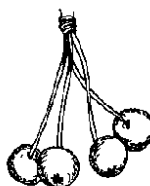

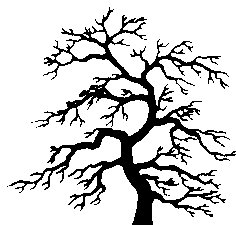

Like other members of the rose family the flowers bear five petals, from white to pink to red, with contrasting yellow stamen in the center. The fruit vary from yellow to maroon, and from the size of a cherry to that of a small apple.
