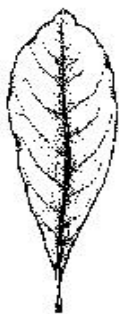


ArborTags



The leaves are alternate, between 2-4 inches long and half as wide. They are broader toward the tip, and taper gently toward the base.

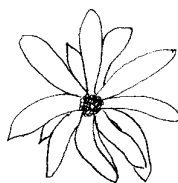

The flowers which bloom in the very early Spring blossom before the leaves appear. With 12-18 fragrant white petals each 1.5 to 2 inches long the Star Magnolia is one of the first plants to welcome Spring.

More often a bush than a small tree the Star Magnolia can grow to 15-20 feet. Thickly branched it often has multiple stems. The large furry buds start forming in mid-summer, and are prominent feature in the Fall and Winter.

The Star Magnolia is one of the first large plants to flower in the Springtime, well before its leaves form. The bright white fragrant large flowers are star-like with 12-14 long white petals. Other Magnolias have cup-shaped flowers which appear later in the Spring.
