Like other mulberries, the toothed leaves are 3-5 inches long and are variously shaped, sometimes with fantastic lobes, sometimes without, on the same tree. The leaf, suspended on a long stalk is glossy

above. Sassafras leaves also come in a variety of highly lobed shapes, but those leaves have smooth edges.
