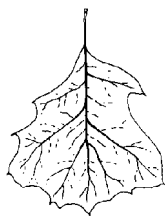


ArborTags



Nearly a triangular shaped leaf with the broadest portion toward the leaf tip. Usually with three broad bristle-tipped lobes, the leaf is shiny yellow-green above and hairy below.

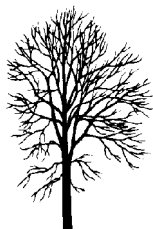
Jack Oak



The acorns are less than an inch long, more narrow than most, and end in a sharp stout point. The cap has distinct overlapping scales.

One of the smaller oaks, it grows to 50 feet with an irregular branching structure giving an open crown. The bark is dark brown and alleagored into small scales. In older trees these scales are quite protruding.
